



Sizing

Logotype should never appear smaller than 1 inch.

Proportions

Keep logotype at orginal proportion. Do not stretch the width or height of logo alone

Coloring

Keep coloring consistent with orginal color scheme. Do not alter colors or add opacity.

The color scheme used is meant to directly correspond with colors related to sea turtles and the ocean, while also remaining clear and concise throughout.

The use of the **turquoise green** is meant to symbolize the color of the sea turtles as well as the sea itself. The **orange** just so happened to be near the complimentary color of the green and also symbolizing the sand at the beach.



The information side of the business card is sectioned off into two different parts, on the top resides the name and position of the person, in the largest font (Poiret One, 16pt and 14pt respectively) to make more of an impact. 

Apply for an Apprenticeship

Research Assistantship (RA) positions are voluntary (unpaid) and selected RAs are expected to plan and finance their own travel to and from Bocas del Toro, Panama.

Good knowledge of Spanish and English is required. Applicants with: 1) education in biology or related fields, 2) previous fieldwork with sea turtles, and 3) experience working/living in multicultural environments in isolated locations for extended periods will be most competitive for these positions. Availability for the entirety of one specified time interval for the BINMP program (27 April through 31 July or 25 July through 2 November) is preferred.

Why care about Sea Turtles?

Sea turtles, especially green sea turtles, are one of the very few animals to eat sea grass. Like normal lawn grass, sea grass needs to be cut short to be healthy and help it grow across the sea floor rather than just growing longer grass blades. Sea turtles and manatees act as grazing animals that cut the grass short and help maintain the health of the sea grass beds. Over the past decades, there has been a decline in sea grass beds. This decline may be linked to the lower numbers of sea turtles.
